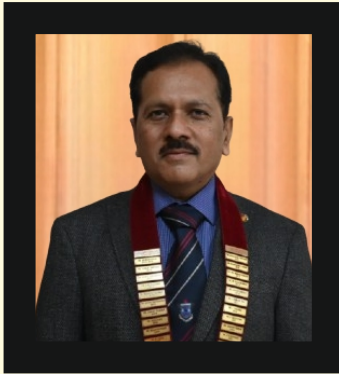

Cancer patients diagnosed with cancer in India per year is reaching to almost fifteen lakh new cases per year and more than half of these patients are dying of cancer sooner or later. Non-uniformity of treating facilities across the country making it difficult for cancer control. Cancer economics is a big challenge today with high rise of treatment cost and affordability disparity. Most of these cancers are solid tumors and cancer surgery is an integral part of the treatment and contributes significantly to the survival of the patient as R0 resection only way to achieve the desired outcome.

India is vast country with variable treatment facility at first second and tier three cities. For the country at large, proper training in cancer surgery and availability of trained man power in cancer surgery are real needs of the hour with growing armamentarium like laparoscopic / robotic cancer surgery. At present per year nearly 350 new cancer surgeons are getting trained all across India. There are many hinderances in uniformity in training across country unable to give a back up bench strength for cancer control.

This include issues like uneven distribution of the training facilities in the country, non-uniformity of training modules across various institutions, lacunae in skill and knowledge updation of the practising surgical oncologists and lack of job opportunity for passing out cancer surgeons. Leaders in oncology heading various major institutes, many are members in committees deciding the curriculum of medical education and public health care in the country and many are involved in training a large number of surgeons in Surgical Oncology. I strongly feel that it is the responsibility of IASO is to act as conduit between these leaders who are also international stalwarts in surgical oncology, to young budding onco-surgeons and use their collective opinions, power and actions to create better environment for the younger onco-surgeons and cancer surgery in the country.

IASO now with the vibrant leadership is growing well and spreading its wing across India and abroad, by its efforts and also collaborating with many national and international associations like SSO ESSO BASO Brazil SO society.

I am sure all these attempts are going to brighten the scope of specialty of Surgical Oncology in the country. 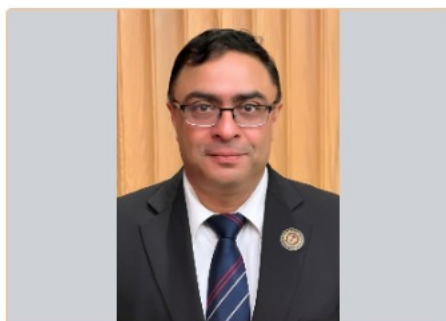

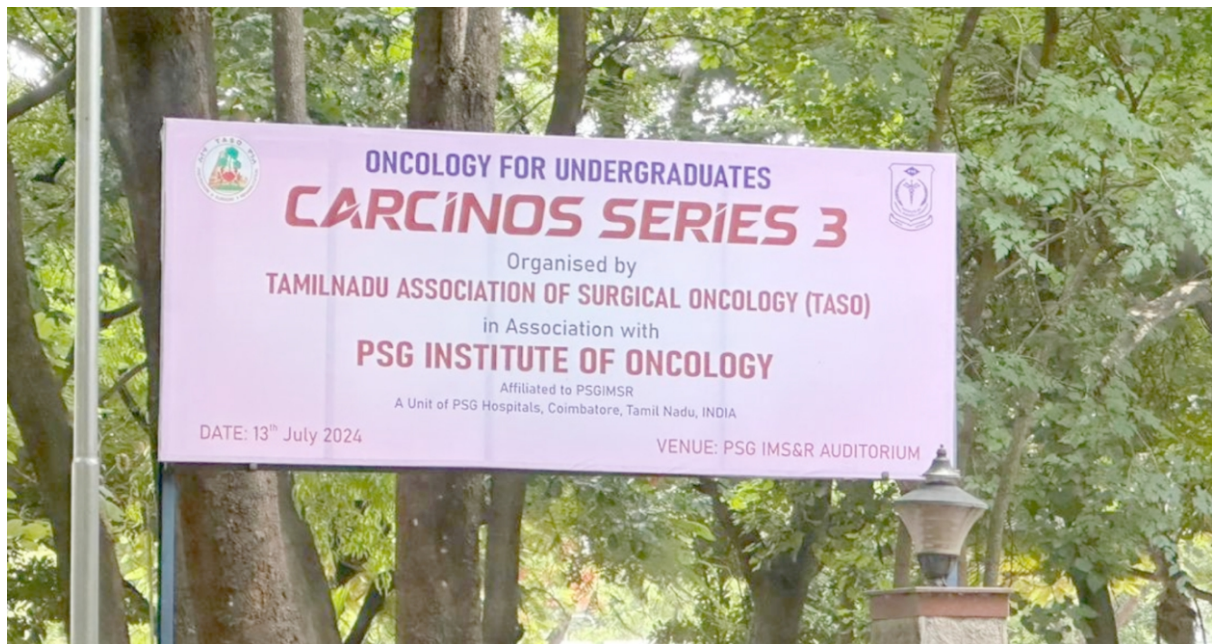

A Short Note on way forward for GST liabilities mitigation

- There have been several discrepancies in the annual accounts which have been corrected in the annual accounts of FY 2023-24.
- FD certificate amounts along with accrued interests have been duly matched with bank certificates.
- Membership fees have been accounted for based on the amounts actually received from members as derived from the data of CC Avenue and not on the basis of credits in the bank accounts.
- Salaries paid to several office assistants of IASO are duly reconciled
- Award monies paid to doctors are also reconciled name wise.

GST registration process

- GST data for FY 2017-18 has already been time barred by Law hence GST liability may not be discharged.
- All other data has been compiled so far except the Annual membership data as address of members are not readily available. And depending upon the address of members CGST, SGST or IGST will be applied
- Once registration is obtained only then GST can be paid. A dialogue has been initiated with the top most GST authority for minimum imposition of Penalty if we declare it voluntarily. GST along with applicable interest.
- Once GST registration is obtained whole process of accounting will change as every month two GST returns namely GSTR (Due date every 10 th day of every month) and GSTR3B (Due date every 20th day of every month) are to be filed on monthly basis.
- For this purpose all GST related data is to be updated by 5 day of every month so that there is no delay.

Post registration following actions are needed to be taken on priority basis.

- CC Avenue instructions has to be modified. They have to generate tax invoice for each receipt along with following details.
 - Name and Address of Member
 - Additional CGST of 9% and SGST of 9% for doctors resident in Uttar Pradesh
 - Additional IGST of 18% for doctors not resident in Uttar Pradesh
 - Tax Invoice number
 - Tax Invoice date
 - SAC code
- All such information should reach IASO by 5 day of following month irrespective of the fact whether CC Avenue has credited the amount to IASO account or not. CC Avenue should also raise Tax Invoice for their commission deductions so that IASO can avail input credit.
- The contract with “Springer India” has to be renegotiated as IASO will raise Tax invoices with GST of 18% for Royalty receivable. This additional GST will be revenue neutral to “Springer India”
- All vendors have to be informed about the New registration number of GST so that IASO can claim the ITC from their respective invoices.

IASO NATCON 2024

37th Annual Conference of the Indian Association of Surgical Oncology

The 37th Annual Conference of the Indian Association of Surgical Oncology (IASO NATCON 2024) was held at the Clark's Convention Centre, Bengaluru, from September 26-29, 2024. 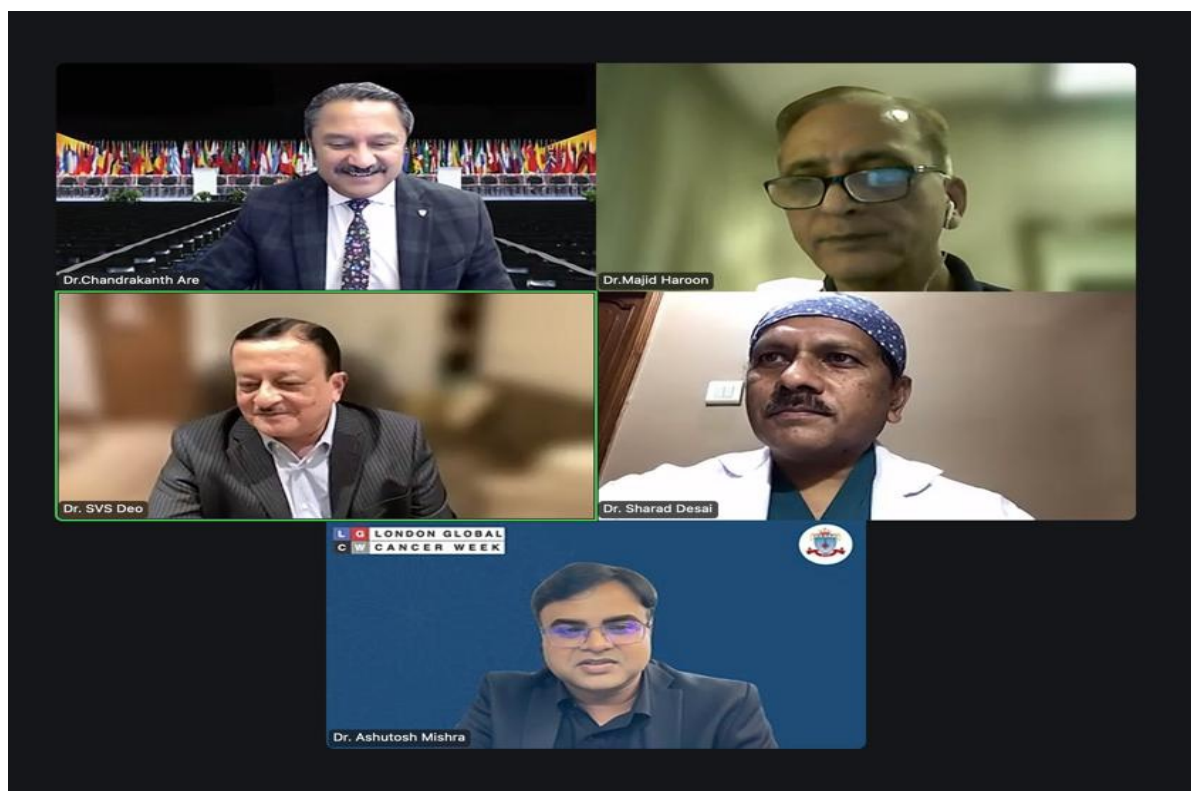

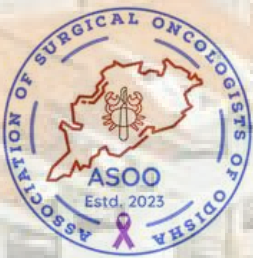

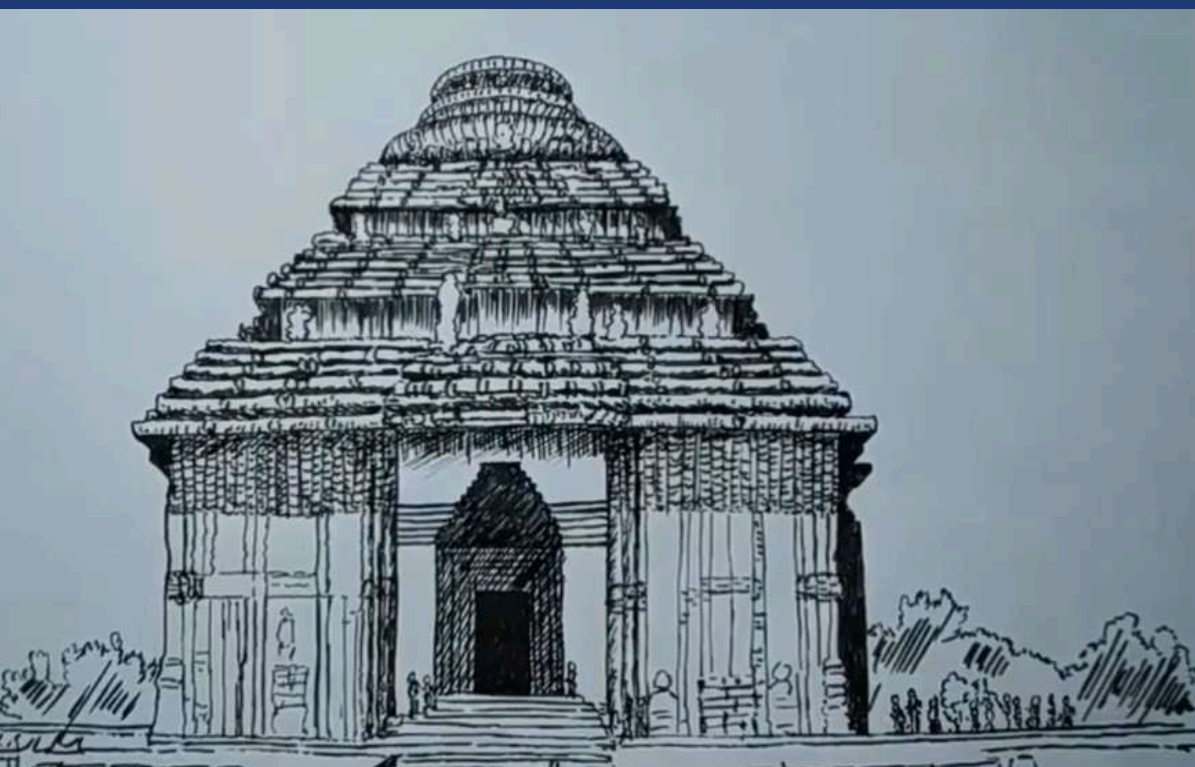
