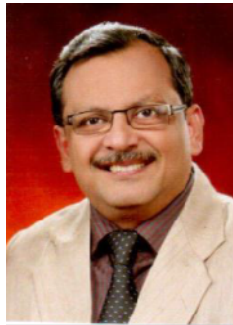

Know Thy Association :

Announcement of Election :

Elections for the post of Vice President and for One Executive Committee Member each from North/South/West Zone will be held in the Annual Conference of IASO during forthcoming ICC 2017.

Important Bye laws of the association.

Bye Law 9 regarding Election of Office Bearers

- a. Election of the vacant posts as notified by the Secretary of IASO will be conducted before the Annual General Body Meeting in a special session 'Elections IASO' to be held during the annual conference of IASO (NATCON IASO) every year.
- b. Nomination for Vacant posts will be called by the Secretary in March / April of the year of election. They will also be advertised in the Newsletter- December issue of the preceding year. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007)
- c. The last date for nomination being 30 August of the year of elections. The nominations are to be sent to the Secretary, IASO. If 30 August is a holiday the next working day will be the last date. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007) .**The nomination can be sent by email or by normal mail only and to reach the Secretary at or before 1700 hrs on the said . Nominations rendered by Whatsapp/Facebook or any other means apart from the ones specified will be rejected (Approved GBM Jodhpur 2007).**
- d. No member will contest for more than one post at the same time. Every eligible member shall be proposed and seconded by two full members of IASO. One member can propose or second only one candidate. There should be a signed no objection certificate and consent from the candidate with the nomination. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007)
- e. At the time of sending the nomination the candidate should send the following information – He should send a brief summary of his/her achievements (a brief background about his achievements and contributions – publications, conference organised, scientific contribution etc.), contribution to IASO and Bio-data, all this not exceeding 250 words and signed by him/her . This should also have a mention of IASO conferences attended in last 5 years. This should be signed and dated by the candidate. This information will be put forward to the members before the voting. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007)
- f. Invalid Nomination – If the nomination is found invalid the candidate will be informed about the same and the reason for invalidity mentioned. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007)
- g. Withdrawal of Nomination – The candidates can withdraw their nominations till the executive meeting or 5.00PM on first day of NATCON IASO. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007)

h. The nominations that are received in time will be scrutinized by President elect .The President elect will be the returning officer. (Approved GBM Hyderabad 20 Sept 2008)

i. Voting – The voting will be by a secret ballot every year during the NATCON IASO in a special session ‘Elections IASO’ before the Annual General Body Meeting. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007)

i. Each member will have to sign the register before voting and receiving the ballot paper. If /when membership cards are available it should be presented for inspection before voting.

ii. The President IASO, President Elect and Vice President, Secretary will guide the election process and the counting will be done under their supervision. Election officer to be the President or President elect.

j. A nominee of the candidate / candidate himself or herself will be present during the counting of ballots. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007)

k. Results will be declared during the GBM. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007)

l. If there is no contest the President shall declare the member elected for the post in GBM. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007)

m. If no nomination is received, it is on the President and President elect to nominate one person for that post. (Approved GBM Ludhiana 22 Sept 2007)

n. Eligibility for elections–

i. Vice President – A full member of IASO who has completed 10 years as full life member (up to 31st March of the year of applying) and has served at least one term as an elected/nominated Executive member is eligible to contest for the post of Vice President. (Approved GBM Varanasi 23 Sept 2006 and Approved GBM Hyderabad 20 Sept 2008)

ii. Secretary – A Full life member of IASO who has completed 7 years (up to 31st March of the year of applying) as full life member and has served at least one term as an elected/nominated Executive member is eligible to contest for the post of Secretary. (Approved GBM Hyderabad 20 Sept 2008) (nominated : approved GBMdelhi 2013)

iii. Treasurer – A Full life member of IASO who has completed 7 years (up to 31st March of the year of applying) as full life member and has served at least one term as an elected/nominated Executive member is eligible to contest for the post of Treasurer (approved GBMdelhi 2013)

iv. Editorial Secretary – A Full life member of IASO who has completed 7 years (up to 31st March of the year of applying) as full life member and has served at least one term as an elected/nominated Executive member is eligible to contest for the post of Editorial Secretary. (Approved GBM Hyderabad 20 Sept 2008)

v. Associate Editor – A Full life member of IASO who has completed 5 years (up to 31st March of the year of applying) as full life member is eligible to contest for the post of Associate Editor. (Approved GBM Hyderabad 20 Sept 2008)

- vi. Executive Committee Member – Candidates who have put in a minimum 5 years full life membership of IASO till 31st March of the year of applying for the executive committee are eligible to election to Executive Committee. (Approved GBM Hyderabad 20 Sept 2008)
- o. Cut off date for eligibility to vote for Full life Members who have been inducted as new members will now be 31st Dec of the previous year of election for voting right for current year. (Approved GBM Hyderabad 20 Sept 2008)
- p. One executive should complete his term before taking over another assignment. (Approved GBM Hyderabad 20 Sept 2008)

Report on IASO NATCON 2016

Jodhpur 22-25 Sept 2016

The 30th Annual National Conference of Indian Association of Surgical Oncology was held at the ITC Welcome Hotel, in the Sun City of India, Jodhpur from 22nd to 25th September, 2016. The Theme of the conference was “Technology to Reality”. Suncity Oncology Society in association with the All India Institute of Medical Sciences hosted the conference. All the eminent oncologists of Rajasthan contributed wholeheartedly to make it a grand event. Prof Sanjeev Misra was the Organizing Chairman and Virendra Rajpurohit was the Organizing Secretary for the 30th NATCON IASO 2016.

The preconference workshop was organized in the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Jodhpur on 22nd of Sep. First session “How to write a manuscript and get it published” was very elaborately conducted by Dr Arun Chaturvedi and David Rew for 4 hours and was attended by around 100 delegates. It was followed by hands on training of Stapling techniques and MIS modules. The last session was Leadership in Oncology conducted by Harit Chaturvedi.



The 30th NATCON IASO, that lasted for two and half days took place at ITC Welcome Hotel, Jodhpur.

The scientific program comprised of generous mix of orations, master videos, research presentations, panel discussions, debates, symposia, poster and oral presentation. The conference witnessed the presence of eminent surgical oncologists of the country as well as from abroad, including current and past presidents of the SSO. It was well attended by other specialist too viz medical & radiation oncologist, general surgeons, gynecologist, ENT specialist, pathologist, radiologist and orthopedics.



Motibhai oration was delivered by Jeffrey A Drebin from USA, Radha Devi Oration was delivered by M Vijayakumar from Mangalore, NC Misra Oration was delivered by Daniel G Coit from USA and Raja Rao Endowment lecture was delivered by Aviram Nissan from Israel.

Highlights of the conference were Symposia on Robotics and HIPEC and panel discussion on "Standardization in Surgical Oncology Training and Curriculum in India". The master video as well as free video sessions were very well attended. The enthusiasm of young oncologist was reflected in the huge no of submitted abstracts which was 219 to be precise, out of which few were selected for oral presentation. Winners of the oral as well as video presentations were given cash awards.

His Highness Maharaja Gaje Singh Ji of Jodhpur inaugurated the 30th NATCON IASO. He congratulated the organizing team for flawlessly conducting this prestigious academic meeting in Jodhpur for the first time. Welcome address was delivered by SanjeevMisra, Presidential speech by HaritChaturvedi, Secretary's report by T SybramanyeshwarRao and Vote of thanks by VirendraRajpurohit. Gala dinner and Cultural evening followed the inauguration ceremony. Celebrity folk singer Mame Khan entertained the audience with his mesmerizing performances for three entertaining hours. Traditional Rajasthani delicacies were very much appreciated by all the guests.

Proceedings of EC Meet at NATCON 2016

23rd September, 2016

Agenda:

- 1) President called the meeting to order
- 2) President welcomed the gathering
- 3) Minutes of the previous EC meeting held at Delhi were approved.

Decision by the previous EC to appoint a person for managing Secretary's Office with tentatively fixed salary of Rs.25000 per month was confirmed.

- 4) Secretary's report was approved by EC.
- 5) Statement of Accounts for the year 2016 and Audited statement by the Treasurer was accepted by EC.
- 6) Discussion on various fellowship

Detroit Fellowship

Dr. Donald Weaver suggested that IASO, in consultation with him, should take necessary steps to clear road blocks for Detroit fellowships. This was approved by EC.

The SSO career development programme

Dr. Chandrakanth Are promised that he will sponsor a few registrations for SSO meeting in his father's name (Dr.DasaradhNaidu). The sponsorship will be documented wherever appropriate.The list of selected people should be informed to SSO within two weeks of selection.

- 7) Venue for NATCON 2018

There was only one proposal to host NATCON IASO 2018 and it was from Trivandrum. This was approved by EC and marked for approval by GB.

- 8) Website

The task of Website administration was given to DrMallikaTiwari. She will be assisted by Dr. AshuthoshChauhan. All EC members are requested to contribute to website development and maintenance.

- 9) Elections

Dr. BKC Mohan Prasad, election officer, presented the nominations for various posts.

- 10) Other Matters

- a. Saving Income Tax

The President reiterated that spending money for the right purpose should be our aim, and at the same time we should be finding out new avenues for income generation. The huge income tax being paid last year was

discussed and there was suggestion by Dr.Sanjay Sharma that the money being spent on education may be tax free, by provision of income tax rules. Dr. Sanjay Sharma has volunteered to collect and provide necessary documents containing rules regarding such provisional to the Treasurere

b. IASO Events

IASO was associated with 7 events last year (2015) . The President observed that IASO should have more involvement in such meetings. In future events, IASO should have a desk in the meeting and a team of IASO members including EC members should attend and actively be involved in such meetings.

c. NATCON Speakers

It was decided that the sponsored speeches should be during breakfast/lunch/dinner. During prime hours the speakers should not be repeated more than once. The aim of latter endeavor is to provide platform for presentation of more diverse experience

d. Issue about continued association with ASI

MostEC members voted to move out of ASI in a phased manner.

e. Use of PAN cards of Host Associations for Meetings

It was decided that the PAN card of Host Association should be be used for IASO Meetings rather thanthe IASO PAN cards

Important Points discussed in General Body Meeting, NATCON 2016

- a) The increasing demand from IASO members to disassociate from original parent body, ASI was discussed. It was decided that a committee should be formed to look in to it by GB. This committee will also look in to requirements of necessary changes in bylaws for this effect. DrMVijayaKumar will be in charge of forming such a committee, and a time period of one month was given him to formulate the committee. He will be assisted by Dr Sanjay Sharma and DrAshutoshChauhan.
- b) General Surgeons who are not members of ASI but are desirous of becoming members of IASO can currently enroll as Associate members. They may be allowed to convert Full membership in future, if the IASO dissociates from ASI and the constitution of IASO is suitably amended.
- c) A point was raised that as per the constitution of IASO, only those people with background in General Surgery could become members of IASO. This deprives surgeons with background in ENT/Gynae/ Ortho/ GI/ Urology the chance of becoming member of IASO. It was clarified that in its present state as a specialty section of the ASI, the IASO cannot enroll people not of General Surgery as member. They can however be permitted to join as Associate Member as on date. The issue will be reconsidered in future once the issue of inter-relationship of IASO and ASI is clarified.
- d) DrChandramohan raised the issue of forming a committee to make some guidelines for Surgical Oncology training, for submitting to the regulatory bodies. The Govt has created a commission to look into medical education at all levels. It was perfect timing to constitute the body of looking into surgical oncology curriculum for specialty and subspecialty training. It should look in the surgical aspect of the training at MS level and about oncology at MBBS level. DrSanjeevMisra offered to host a full day workshop with leaders from across the country participating under the Chairmanship of Dr. SVS Deo. This was discussed in GB and DrSVS Deo is entrusted with the responsibility of preparing a whitepaper
- e) Previous EC meeting's decision to appoint a person for managing Secretary's Office with tentatively fixed salary of Rs.25000 per month was confirmed.
- f) It was decided by GB to create an option in the constitution which would allow the President, Secretary and Treasurer to have a shadow post under their wings, the shadow person should be less than 40 years in age and from the same city. He will attend EC meetings but not have voting rights.

Proceedings of EC Meeting during ASICON 2016

Mysore 16th December 2016

President called the meeting to order.

1. Obituary

EC expressed deep sorrow in demise of Dr. NKannan, Dr. KK Pandey and Dr. Jayanth Saraya

2. Previous minutes of EC was approved.

Issue of distancing from parent ASI was discussed. EC entrusted Dr. M. Vijayakumar to submit a report at mid term meeting and this will be further decided at next GBM

3. Fellowships

a) It is decided by the EC to temporarily suspend Detroit fellowship, owing to lack of necessary cooperation from the Detroit group.

b) Best of SSO Registration fee will be sponsored by Dr. Chandrakanth Are. Dr. Are will provide further details including the name of the programme and number and details of support promised.

4. IASO Meetings

(a) Midterm meeting in Chandigarh will be hosted by Dr. GR Verma.

(b) An IASO- ABSI joint meeting is planned in Dubai in January 2018. The logistics will be decided in consultation with ABSI. Dr. Dhairyasheel Savant will act as IASO representative for coordination with ABSI.

(c) Two meetings will be hosted by Dr. Somasekhar SP at Bangalore. One HIPEC meeting is scheduled in February 2017 and another Cadaver workshop at a later date.

4. Indian Cancer Congress 2017

a) PB Desai Oration will be shifted to NATCON.

b) IASO will also organize a preconference Video workshop at the ICC.

5. NATCON 2018

NATCON 2018 is scheduled to be held at Trivandrum under tutelage of Regional Cancer Center, Trivandrum.

The final dates and Venue will be decided soon.

Kolkatta , 21 Jan 2017

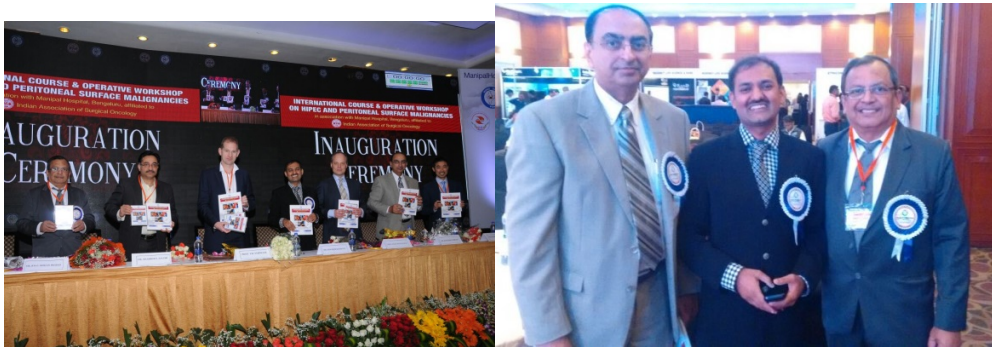

Eminent scientists as well as clinicians of national and international repute came to share their knowledge and experience in the field of cancer. Dr. Rajendra Toprani, Secretary, IASO, graced the symposium as Guest of honour. Prof. Lalit Kumar from AIIMS, New Delhi, and Prof. M.
